

ANNUAL TOWN

Article #38

Voted by voice vote an Ordinance Prohibiting the Placing of Snow in Public Streets or Roads be enacted .  
Be it ordained by the Inhabitants of the Town of Chesterville, as follows:

Section 1. Definition. the word "person" as used herein shall mean any person or persons, firm, association or corporation.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to place or cause to be placed or deposited by any means, any snow or ice, on any public streets or roads, without immediately causing the same to be removed from said streets or roads.

Section 3. Every person convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), to be recovered by a complaint before the Maine District Court, District XII, Division of Franklin, subject however, to the rights of exception and appeal as are provided by law. All fines recovered shall be to the use and benefit of the Inhabitants of the Town of Chesterville.

Section 4. This ordinance may be amended by a majority vote of any legal town meeting when such amendment is published in the warrant calling for the meeting.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect as soon as the Town of Chesterville votes to enact it .

Article #39

Voted by voice vote to accept the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) IN TRUST from the Execatrix of the Last Will and estate of James D. Walton for the perpetual care and maintenance of the on entire Walton lot, so-called , in Norcross Cemetery, in Chesterville under and subject to the following conditions, vis:

- (1) That said sum shall be deposited in a reputable savings bank and the income thereof applied to said care and maintenance.
- (2) That said Town shall have the authority to utilize the principal if in its discretion it deems the income insufficient for the purpose stated.

Article #40

To act on any other business that may legily come before said Meeting.
