ARTICLE 26

if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and dispose of titles held by the Town on such terms as they deem advisable and the quit claim deed for the same.

ARTICLE 27

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase and maintenance of a new dumping area.  
Recommended \$1,000.00

ARTICLE 28

Shall an ordinance controlling the deposition of rubbish within the Town of Chesterville be enacted?

SECTION 1 Establishing a Town Dump

The Town of Chesterville may maintain and operate a Town Dump. Any rubbish originating within the Town of Chesterville may be placed on the Town Dump. All rubbish so placed shall become the property of the Town. Any person removing same without a permit shall be guilty of a violation.

SECTION 2 Other Dumping Areas

No person, persons, or municipality other than the Town of Chesterville shall establish or maintain a dump either public or private for the disposal of rubbish within the Town of Chesterville unless the designated area in the opinion of the Board of Selectmen and the Health Officer does not constitute a fire hazard, health hazard, or is not detrimental to surrounding property.

SECTION 3 Hours of Operation of Town Dump

The Board of Selectmen shall establish the hours during which the Town Dump shall be open.

SECTION 4 Materials to be Deposited on Dump

Rubbish as referred to above shall include all household, commercial and industrial wastes. No putrefaction, auto bodies, or parts thereof shall be deposited on dump.

SECTION 5 Scavenger Permits

No person or persons shall remove any material whatsoever from the dump without written permission from the Board of Selectmen.

SECTION 6 Burning of Dump

No person or persons other than the selectmen shall burn the dump or any part thereof.

SECTION 7 Enforcement

Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine or not less than \$25. or more than \$100. for each offense. The Board of Selectmen and the several constables of the Town of Chesterville shall be responsible for enforcement.

ARTICLE 29

Shall an ordinance establishing a Town "Auto Graveyard" and "Junk Yard" be enacted?

Section 1 Establishing a Town "Auto Graveyard and Junk Yard".

The Town of Chesterville may establish and maintain an "Auto Graveyard" and "Junk Yard". The state statute shall apply to it and throughout the Town of Chesterville.

### Article #37

Voted by voice vote the Amendment of Ordinance Controlling the Disposition of Rubbish within the Town of Chesterville  
To amend, under the provisions of Title 30, Section 2151, M.R.S.S. as amended, Section I of "Ordinance Controlling the Disposition of Rubbish within the Town of Chesterville", which was enacted on March 7, 1966, by Adding thereto so much of it as is here underlined:

#### Section I.

The Town of Chesterville may maintain and operate a Town Dump. Any rubbish originating within the Town of Chesterville may be placed on the Town Dump. No person shall deposit at the Town Dump refuse of any kind which has been transported from any residence or place of business outside the municipal boundaries of the Town of Chesterville without a permit issued by the Town of Chesterville through the office of the Town Clerk. Such permits may be obtained annually at a cost of five dollars (\$5.00) for each residence; ten dollars (\$10.00) for each apartment house or place of business. Revenue generated under the provisions of the section shall be applied to the maintenance of the Town Dump. All rubbish so placed shall become the property of the Town. Any person removing same without a permit shall be guilty of a violation.

TOWN OF CHESTERVILLE  
SPECIAL TOWN MEETING  
May 16, 1977

The town meeting began at 12 P.M. on May 16, 1977 to act on Articles I and II of this warrant, and again at 7:30 to act on Articles III through VII.

Article I

To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.  
Granville Storer was nominated for Moderator, seconded, and received one written vote and was declared Moderator.

Article II

To see if the Town will allow to authorize the sale on Sunday of malt liquor (beer, ale and other malt liquors) and table wine to be consumed off the premises of establishments licensed to sell malt liquor and wine for consumption off the premises.  
The results of this Article were as follows: YES - 82 votes cast. NO - 12 votes cast. The Article was passed by a majority of the votes.

Article III

To see what the Town wishes to do with the Federal Revenue Sharing money for the Entitlement periods, eight and nine (Jan. 1, 1977 through Sept. 30, 1978)  
Recommended: Town Equipment Account

A motion was made to purchase a new equipped truck with this money, it was seconded, and passed with an aye vote by the majority of the people.

Article IV

To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Excise money, the amount of \$1,000 to cover Social Security.

A motion was made to pass this article, seconded and passed with an aye vote By the majority of the people.

Article V

To see if the Town will vote to use \$12,757 of the Anti-recession money for Summer Road Account maintenance and repair.

Recommended:

A motion was made to pass this Article as read, seconded and passed with an aye vote by the majority of the people.

Article VI

To see if the Town will vote to use \$5,000 of the Anti-recession money for maintenance of the Town Garage.

A motion was made to pass this article, seconded, and passed with an aye vote by the majority of the people.

Article VII

Town Dump discussion pertaining to D.E.P. regulations.

It was decided that the Town Dump would be kept open only two days a week, preferably Tuesday and Sunday. There will be an attendant on these two days and residents will receive stickers for use of the Town Dump.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting, seconded and passed. The meeting adjourned at 10 P.M.

To see if the town will vote to ~~XXXXXX~~ prohibit smoking upstairs in the Chesterville Town Hall, or act on anything relating thereto.  
Motion to pass Article. Seconded and passed by AYE vote.

Article 41

To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair the Chesterville Center Cemetery.  
Motion made to raise \$300.00 to repair Cemetery. Seconded and passed by AYE vote.

Article 42

To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for resurfacing the East Road.  
Motion made to pass over this article. Seconded and passed.

Article 43

To see if the town will vote to have the Annual Town Meeting on Saturday evening instead of Monday evening.  
Motion to ammend Article 43 to read Saturday A.M. instead of Monday evening.  
Seconded and passed by AYE vote.

Article 44

To see if the town will vote to raise the fee charged for Dump permits from \$5.00 to \$15.00 starting March 7, 1979.  
Motion to pass as read. Seconded and passed AYE vote.

Article 45

To act on any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

Article 46

To see what sum the Town will raise to use with TFI money for rebuilding the Archer road. Motion made to appropriate \$4,000.00. Seconded and passed with Aye vote.

Gertrude Archer sworn in as Town Treasurer. David Archer sworn in as 3rd Selectman.  
Motion made to adjourn; seconded, and meeting adjourned at 10:30 PM.

Recommended: \$5,000.00.

A motion was made and seconded to pass this Article as recommended. 31 For 10 Against.

Article IV

To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to transfer from surplus to add 1 inch of sealer to the new section of the Borough Road.

Recommended: \$8,800.00.

A motion was made and seconded to pass this Article as read. 27 For 14 Against.

Article V

To see what the town wishes to do with the Federal Revenue Sharing money for the entitlement period 1 October 1978 through 30 September 1979. Amount available \$17,577.00. Selectmen Recommend: New truck.

A motion was made and seconded to pass this Article as recommended: A total of 57 votes cast: 37 For 18 Against 2 Invalid.

Article VI

To see if the town will approve a new Ordinance for the town dump. Section 8 ADD: No person or persons shall enter the dump area other than designated operating hours.

A motion was made and seconded to pass this Article as read by a majority "aye" vote.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting, seconded and passed. The meeting was adjourned at P.M.
